Dr. Jung-Yul Choi of Busan, Republic of Korea, was elected to serve as international president of Lions Clubs International at the association's 102nd International Convention, held in Milan, Italy, July 5 through July 9, 2019.

A member of the Busan Jae-il Lions Club since 1977, President Choi has held many offices within the association, including club president, cabinet secretary, district governor and international director. He also served numerous times as a DGE Group Leader and served on 11 committees as a member of the International Board of Directors. In addition, he was a chairperson of the 39th OSEAL Forum in 2000 and a host committee chairperson at

the 95th Lions International Convention in Busan in 2012, the largest convention ever held in Lions history.

In recognition of his service to the association, President Choi has received numerous awards, including the Humanitarian Partnership; Senior Master Key Award; 100% District Governor Award; multiple International President's Leadership Awards; multiple International President's Awards; and an Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. He is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his Lion activities, President Choi is chief executive officer of Koala Company, Ltd., an international trading company, and is also a past director of the Busan Sports Association.

President Choi and his wife, Seung-Bok, have one son, four daughters and two granddaughters.



At last count only 108 Ohio Lions license plates have been sold and we need to reach 150 for the plates to remain available after September 25, 2019.

You can renew your vehicle registration upto 90 days before your renewal date (typically your birthdate) without any additional

charges. So if your renewal date is after the September cut-off but within the 90-day window you can renew early and still be counted. To order your plates simply go to www.oplates.com or your local deputy registrar / BMV and request the Lions Club logo license plate. There is a \$25 additional charge for the Lions Club logo plate, however \$15 is a contribution to the Ohio Lions Foundation.
