Service Activities Around the District

BELLEFONTAINE Donated 35 dozen buns to Our Daily Bread for Hunger Relief on July 16th, serving 420 people.

BLUFFTON Recycled 2 pair of hearing aids for Hospice on July 20th & Recycled 19 large ink cartridges and many small cartridges on July 17th.

Reported on July 16th that to date this year we have collected 9,123 pairs of eyeglasses and sent to the VOSH sorting center for third-world missions.

DESHLER Made a \$100 donation to New Beginnings United Methodist Church & donated \$209.30 for a pair of glasses for needy person on July 9th.

FINDLAY One eye case for Cataracts reviewed and forwarded to Northwest Lions Eye Care. 22 pairs of reading glasses dispensed to individuals on July 23rd. Six Lion volunteers served 23 people.

On June 1st used Glasses were picked up and 723 pairs delivered to VOSH in Pandora.

At the June 25th meeting, held at Steve's Dakota Grill at 6:30pm., District Governor Bill Niejadik inducted Ricardo Luci as a new member and installed officers. One eye case was approved, and another referred to NW Ohio Eye Care Foundation for cataract surgery.

BRYAN LIONESS There were seven birthdays at the Genesis Center in July. We served the Senior Birthday Luncheon at the Bryan Senior Center on Thursday, July 12th.



PERRYSBURG SUNRISE Soup Kitchen assistance: Two members at 2 separate locations each volunteered to feed folks at soup kitchens in Toledo, OH for Hunger Relief on July 11th and July 25th. On each date 150 people were served.

Hunger Relief: Donated eight bags of food to the Food pantry of Maumee United Methodist Church on July 8th and July 16th.

On July 29th two members volunteered at Ohio State Fair at the Office of Ohio Dept. of Natural Resources' (ODNR) Smokey Bear exhibit. We interacted with the kids to teach about fire prevention, not playing with fire or matches, and offered a PLINKO game for the kids to win Smokey Bear goodies. This is our 6th year doing this project and we served 350 people.

On July 21st, July 24th, July 25th, July 27th, and July 28th we cleaned up trails: Lions walked many miles of trails to pick up bags of cans and bottles. Volunteers walked a total of nine miles in Perrysburg and eight miles in Maumee and picked up seven bags of cans and bottles.

PERRYSBURG SUNRISE On July 24th volunteers picked up 9 bags of glasses from 7 locations. Will sort to determine if they are usable or damaged. Usable will go to their mission trip to Mexico. Damaged will be donated to VOSH where they will be able to sell the components for income to offset costs of a mission trip.

On July 6th We set up our booth downtown Perrysburg for the First Friday summer event. We offered corn-hole for the kids. They were able to win stickers or pencils as prizes. We gave out our "Who We are and What We Do" handout to the adults. We also sold prepackaged snacks as a fundraiser; selling 10 of them for \$1 each. A \$5 donation was also accepted. Eight Lion volunteers served 300 people.

NAPOLEON Karsyn Ashbaugh and Gina Eberle have been selected as the recipients of the Napoleon Lions Club scholarships, which totals \$2,000 each, payable over four years. This marks the fourth straight year that the club has sponsored two such scholarships.

Ashbaugh, the daughter of Tom and Darcy, will be attending the University of Toledo, studying nursing. Her cumulative GPA is just under 4.2 and her community service is very well-rounded. She was captain of her swim team, takes part in track at Napoleon High School and was also a setter for the NHS volleyball squad. Eberle, the daughter of Charlie and Christy, will also be attending the University of Toledo and taking up Speech-Language Pathology. Her cumulative GPA is just under 4.1 and her community service was also very well- rounded, with an emphasis in the 4-H program, as well as art. 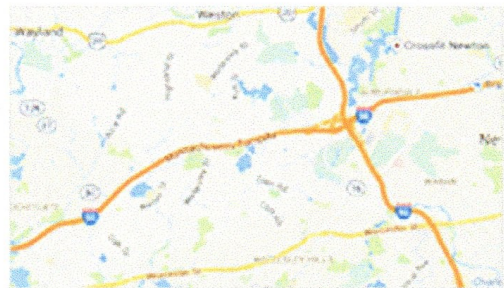

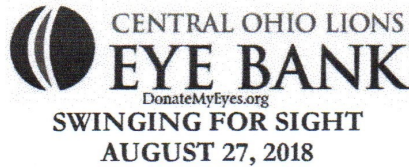
