I would like to take the time to encourage others to take the "plunge" and become a Governor. It is a great experience, you meet high quality people and will make lifelong friends. Ellie and I were fortunate to be in the group from the other districts. We have a bond that will last and we are already looking forward to our first reunion.

Once again, I thank you for the honor of being your Governor. I will continue to serve the District as Sight and Hearing Chair And also as a Zone Chair.


McComb Lions Club had a great turn out at their 52nd Over 80's Party at the McComb American Legion.

Selected articles from the Lion Magazine June.

1946-Arlington, has bought three hospital beds, equipped with sheets and mattresses, and has them for loan to those in need. All were put in service at once.

1949-Defiance, put on a basket ball match between two professional teams to raise money for new uniforms for the high school band. From returns of this match the club was able to give the band a sum of \$500.

1952- Kenton, netted about \$1,000 for sight conservation from its annual minstrel show presented in three night performances. A souvenir program carried advertising.

1959-Ada, The police cruiser radio, a project of the Ada club for the past two and a half years, was installed not so long ago. The equipment cost approximately \$1,250 of which \$650 was raised by the club from Christmas tree sales, a drawing and other money raising activities. The remainder of the money was furnished by Civil Defense.

2010-Defiance, 4,500 food items for pantries collected at a high school football game by Defiance Lions in Ohio in partnership with two school districts.

2012- In Honduras, District 13A, 13B and 13G Lions from Ohio presented personal energy transportation (PET) vehicle to a 14-year-old girl disabled from polio, which will enable her to go to school.

Dues Credits for Membership Drops.

Beginning June 30, 2018, dues credits for membership drops will not be issued after the release of the semi-annual billings on July 1 and January 1. Board Policy prohibits LCI from issuing membership dues credits, and the International Board of Directors recently decided that enforcement of existing policy is necessary in order to be in compliance with Board Policy. Here's how you can help your clubs prepare:

Remind club leaders to update their club rosters online using MyLCI or their regional reporting system.

Encourage club leaders to submit their membership rosters to LCI prior to June 30, 2018.

Inform current and future club leaders that membership dues credits will no longer be issued.

Bluffton: 270 trees planted by Lions club members. 2 Lion members attended a optometric mission into Saint Maarten to care for nearly 3,000 children and teachers in the primary grades. 8 optometrists examined the children and glasses were provided for approximately 26% of the children with 9 referrals for ophthalmology care.

Waynesfield: Collected more than 250 pairs of eyeglasses.

Wapakoneta: Provided popcorn, snow cones, and cotton candy for the annual Wapakoneta High School Field Day utilizing our iconic 1938 Pierce Arrow Trailer

North Baltimore: Cleaned a 1/2 mile section of the Slippery Elm bicycle trail in North Baltimore.

Lima Host: Vision screening for two preschool classes.

Glandorf: Picked up trash along St Rt 224 for the Adopt a highway program. Picked up food for the local Knapsack program for local school kids.

Van Buren: Participated in a community wide garage sale and collected used ink cartridges and mailed in to the recycle company

Portage: Completed annual Vidalia Onion Sale, sold 2050 pounds and raised over \$600. Did our first highway clean-up of the year, collecting 25 bags of trash.

Ottoville: Donated \$500 to Ottoville Parish Center on behalf of Club Member Donald Schlagbaum's wife: Dee Dee Schlagbaum for purchase of New Roasters used for various activities with Lions Club and Community (Fundraisers, Weddings, Funerals).

Holgate: 5 signs put up for community activities and sold cheese to raise money for our activity fund. Sylvania Sunrise: Hosted its annual Fishing Derby at the Merickel Farley Trout Club.

Mendon: Donation to District 13 OH1 toward the purchase of a 2nd vision screening machine.

Findlay: Hearing devise found in used glasses will be given to VOSH.


