According to Stephen Seagrave of the Delta-Liberty Lions Club, "Service to youth and literacy are two of the service missions of Lions International. The dictionary project for our LC children ties both of these missions together." The 3rd graders were shown a Power Point about Lions community service and how the dictionaries could be used as reference tools. The children were amazed to learn that the longest word in the dictionary has 1909 letters.

The dictionaries the children received include special sections and reference material beyond a simple dictionary. This makes it useful in many ways for reference. Other sections include:

- Information about weights and numbers
- Information about our country and the 50 states
- Maps of the world and information about various countries
- Pictures of sign language hand positions and Braille designs

Current Lions Club projects include: (1) provide eyeglasses for needy PDY & LC residents, (2) provide dictionaries for PDY & LC 3rd grade students, (3) collect and recycle used eyeglasses for the needy, (4) support our annual preschool vision screening project, (5) volunteer transportation for visually impaired residents in the Delta and Liberty Center area to stores and appointments, (6) support Backpack Buddies at PDY, and (7) a \$500 scholarship for graduating senior at PDY and at LC.

The Ohio Lions state Youth Committee met on September 9, 2017. Below is information from that meeting:


