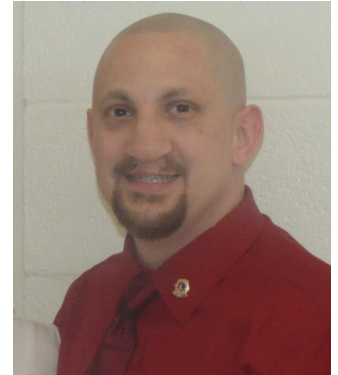


Zone and District Events

Kaitlyn's Cottage Demo Event "Tobii Dynavox Eye Tracker"



On October 10, 2018 PDG Sheryl Burnette shared at the Kaitlyn's Cottage Demo Event for the recently purchased "Tobii Dynavox Eye Tracker" device for non-verbal children and youth that have neurological and communication related disabilities that frequent Kaitlyn's Cottage.

This device helps the children communicate their wants, needs, emotions and



feelings. PDG Sheryl shared to the group assembled the process a LCIF Grant and how a grant of this type can help within our communities. This grant was made possible by LCIF, Lions – Anthem Foundation "Healthy Heroes Grant", and many Defiance City Organizations.

The event was well attended by representatives from 11 different local and District Lions Organizations as well as representatives from the Anthem Foundation that Lions Clubs International Foundation has partnered with to provide grants for this kind of equipment that will better enrich the lives of those children with communicative difficulties.

Doug Bush, President of Defiance Regional Hospital, opened the afternoon with an introduction to Kaitlyn's Cottage and how it has impacted the Defiance Community and surrounding areas. Fellow speakers were, PDG Sheryl, as explained above, also speaking was Greg LaManna a representative from Anthem Foundation sharing on how Anthem got involved with LCIF, and Kelly Tong, Project supervisor for Kaitlyn's Cottage shared information on the "Tobii Dynavox Eye Tracker" device and its uses. She also gave a demonstration of the device and how a participant would use the device. Refreshments were enjoyed by all and a tour of Kaitlyn's Cottage was taken by those interested.

BLUFFTON Bike path on October 2nd, Bike path dedication with ribbon cutting for our 4th bike path out of the master plan for pathways throughout the village. This is the fourth section of pathways in the master plan of this Lion's legacy project.



On October 2nd, 3 high school students supported with donation to participate in the American Legion Boys & Girls State, the most respected and



selective educational program of government instruction for US high school students. Bluffton Lions help these students gain an experience of a lifetime.

Speaker on October 2nd was Grace Paquin with her puppy Nova. Accompanying Grace was her father as they told the story of training a dog for the Leader Dog organization. This is Grace's Girl Scout project. To be a puppy raiser she had to apply, read a manual and be accepted into the program. At the age of 14 months her puppy, Nova, will go to the Leader Dog organization for formal training to assist the blind and/or deaf.

Served the community meal at the Senior Citizens building on October 4th. 73 meals were served and \$170 donated for the food pantry. Fifteen Lions worked at the meal or donated food/funds for the meal.

OCTOBER 16TH: Mark Suderman, from the Lima Area Habitat for Humanity (HFH), spoke about HFH and Lima Restore. 54 affordable homes in the Allen County area have been built with volunteer help. There are 50 affiliates in Ohio. The Lima Restore tithes 10% of their profit to Guatemala and the Middle East. Both Lima and Findlay have Restores. We can help by donating funds, time, sponsorship, donate items to Restore or help with construction. They are starting a repair program of homes with cost to owners at zero % interest.



WAUSEON October 13th our club held Fall Heartland Picnic for the residents at our local nursing home. We purchased and cooked up hamburger and hotdogs for the residents and a few of their family members. The residents look forward to the food and fellowship that our club members provide.

October 11th our club helped prepare and serve at our community's weekly "Community Meal". We prepared a nice meal of lasagna, salad, bread and assorted cookies, serving 80 people.

October 10th one member participated in the Kaitlyn's Cottage Tobii Dynavox Eye Tracker Demo Event. PDG Sheryl Burnette wrote the matching grant for Kaitlyn's Cottage so that they could purchase this device for the verbally challenged children and youth that frequent Kaitlyn's Cottage. This device helps non-verbal children communicate their desires, wants and needs to their parents and care givers during their stay at Kaitlyn's Cottage.

October 6th Our District 13 OH1 held a STEPS 5K Walk/Run to raise funds for Pediatric Cancer patients. Eight participated in the walk/run and we had more club members that made monetary donations to the cause.

October 2nd, took up a monetary collection for LCIF donation for Hurricane Michael victims raising \$180.

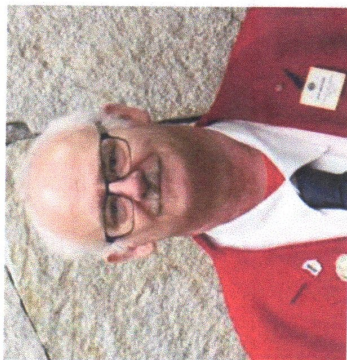
