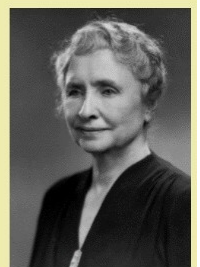

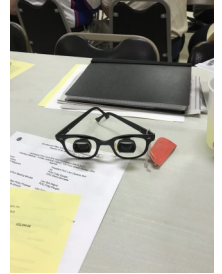

NWOLECF NOTES: At the Aug. 8, 2018 meeting attended by 17 clubs the Foundation reviewed 8 cases; funding help for purchase of special telescopic glasses for student so he could drive was approved. Outcome from emergency retinal surgery of woman from Honduras was reported successful. Cataract surgery for one eye of 64 year old man from Lucas Co. was approved, also cataract surgery for a 52 year old man from Findlay. Another request for help purchasing **biotics glasses** (pictured right) was approved for a young man from Lake Township so that he could drive. A CCTV request were approved for a 64 year old female from Celina. Two requests were placed on hold awaiting further information; help with purchase of an eSight Reader for woman from Bellefontaine and cataract surgery for a man from Delphos. IPDG Bill Niejadlik, 13-OH1 Sight & Hearing Chair, requested help purchasing a second PlusOptic Vision Screening machine to meet all the club demands for screenings, this was approve. LCIF will match district funding for the new machine. All Lions in District 13-OH1 are reminded that they are also members of the Northwest Ohio Lions Eye Care Foundation. The next meeting is Wednesday November 28, 2018 at the Waynesfield Lions Building at 6:30pm.

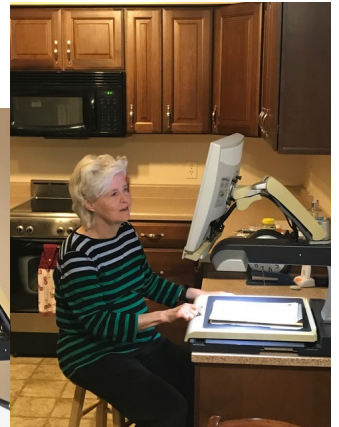

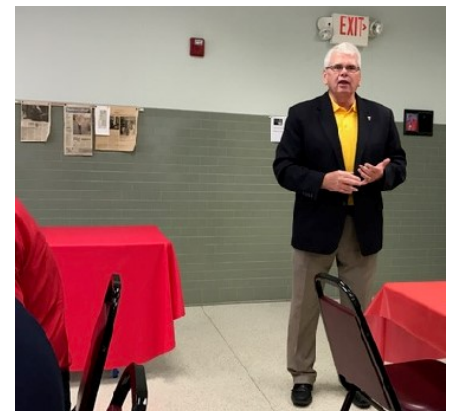

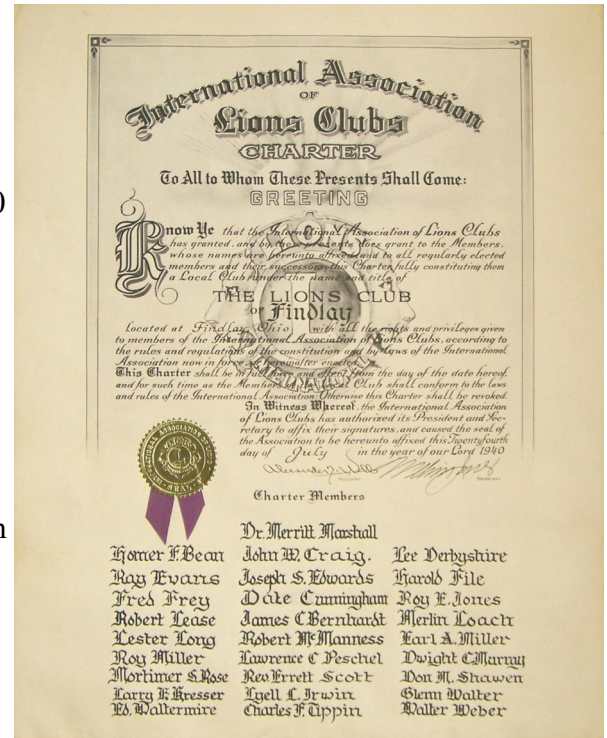

The collection of used eyeglasses is a traditional Lions Club activity. Did you ever wonder what happens to the glasses once they are collected? Look for an article in an upcoming Newsletter! The clubs reporting eyeglass collection for August are:

PERRYSBURG SUNRISE On August 3rd, Eyeglasses were picked up from 7 locations. They've been sorted in usable or damaged/ unusable glasses and also clip-ons and sunglasses. 950 pairs of usable are sorted and boxed for our annual mission trip to Mexico in Feb. 2019. 250 pair of sunglasses/clip-ons have also been sorted. 450 pairs of damaged/



unusable glasses and 250 cases

have been donated to VOSH. They can be sold for the metal and plastic components value. The income used for future missions.

PIONEER On August 23rd, 729 pairs of eyeglasses with frames & without frames were taken for recycling

WAUSEON Our club collects used eyeglasses from our community.

We donate all used eyeglasses to VOSH for mission trips to third world countries to help with their vision needs. On August 24th, we collected 212 pairs of glasses for VOSH.

PERRYSBURG SUNRISE On August 24th, 5 bags of food were donated to the Maumee United Methodist Church food pantry.

On August 20th, 5 Lions and 2 Pilot Dogs donated 49 stuffed animals at Toledo Children's Hospital for the children being treated in the pediatric cancer ward. They will also be given to children afflicted with other ailments. 49 were served.

Clean up trails: On August 18th 2 Lions walked 6 miles and picked up 2 bags of cans and bottles in Milan, MI. On August 15th, a Lion walked 12 miles and picked up 3 bags of cans and bottles in Ann Arbor, MI. On August 12th, a Lion walked 6 miles and picked up 1 bag of cans and bottles in Fairborn, OH. On August 11th, a Lion walked 6 miles and picked up 1 bag of cans and bottles in Fairborn, OH. On August 10th, a Lion walked 6 miles and picked up 2 bags of cans and bottles in Centerville, OH. On August 9th, a Lion walked 6 miles and picked up 1 bag of cans and bottles in Piqua, OH.

On August 1st and again on August 15th, two members provided soup kitchen assistance and volunteered to serve meals at two separate soup kitchens. 150 people were served on each date.

On August 6th, two Lions provided assistance to the blind by picking up a blind Lion and her Pilot Dog so that she would be able to participate in club activities.

On August 5th, 4 bags of food were donated to the food pantry at Maumee United Methodist Church.

PIONEER On August 29th, 2 pairs of eyeglasses were purchased for an adult & an NC student.

On August 10th, birthday gifts were delivered to 6 Evergreen Nursing Home residents

PORTAGE On August 11th, the Portage Lions club reported that they now publish the monthly Village newsletter, the Nitty Gritty. This is a joint venture with the Village Council, Christ United Methodist Church and the Portage Lions Club. All groups and organizations within the Village are encouraged to submit articles. The primary function of the newsletter is to keep the Village residents informed of news and events happening in the Village. This is a Signature Activity.

On August 9th, We participated in United Way's Back to School event, providing preschool vision screenings. We screened 14 children and referred 5.

SYLVANIA SUNRISE Trash pick on Monroe Street was completed on August 25th, serving 100 people. On August 23rd, donated 11 books to the USA/ Canada forum. District Governor Dean will take them to the forum.

VAN BUREN Donated food to local charity for distribution to needy people on August 24th. On August 15th, cleaned a 2 mile stretch of township road. Removed and disposed of garbage found lying on the road, serving 1500 people.



WAUSEON On August 24th, our club purchased one pair of glasses for a needy individual in our community. We also provided funds for the eye exam.

On August 9th, our club helped prepare and serve at our Community's weekly "Community Meal," serving 86 people. We also cleaned up afterwards. Our community holds a weekly meal, free to all in the community. Local churches and other community organizations help prepare, serve, and cleanup on a weekly rotation.

On August 3rd, Our club had 8 lion club members help with trash clean-up along a 2 mile stretch of highway that leads into our community. We picked up 13 bags of trash in this 2 mile stretch.

Service, Fundraising, and Social Events Around the District

BLUFFTON Christine Denecker from the Hancock County Homestead was the speaker for the Bluffton Lions August 21st meeting. She gave the club a good review of farm life including slides from seven farms locally around the Findlay area. There were recorded interviews from members of these farms speaking about generational farms, dairy farms, part-time farmers, farms specializing in specific produce etc. The use of technology was discussed as equipment gets bigger and bigger. Since many people now are not farm based, the public needs to be educated on what a farmer does for society.

BELLEFONTAINE We sold our steak sandwiches at the annual Cruise In in Bellefontaine on August 11th

HOLGATE On August 15th Lions worked two shifts at the Henry County Fair Pork Producers' Food Stand

NAPOLEON August 17th was the date of the Fair Ice Cream Fundraising Event, and \$6000 was raised. August 12th the club had a Float in the Tomato Festival Parade.

PERRYSBURG SUNRISE On August 10th, a Lion donated food and household supplies to the Fisher House at Wright-Patterson AFB while attending his military unit reunion. Annually, this reunion donates \$1000+ in cash and supplies to this respite house for military families whose loved ones are being treated at the hospital.

On First Friday, August 3rd, We set up our booth offering corn-hole for the children with stickers as prizes. Also had 50 used eyeglass cases which had been sanitized. The children were able to decorate them with stickers and wasi-tape and take them home to keep. Snacks were sold, proceeds of \$20. 63 kids participated in a depth perception session. 300 people were served.



On August 16th, at the McDonald's Fundraising Event, 4 Lions greeted customers, swept and mopped floors, cleaned tables, and cleaned window glass for 3 hours at one of our local McDonald's restaurants.

SYLVANIA SUNRISE On August 22nd, our meeting was held at Sidon restaurant. We had speakers Pete and Sara Davis who represent Hope 2 Water. They promote safe healthy water in Haiti. They promote renewable self-sustaining technology to provide safe drinking water. The Kelly Miller Circus (pictured left) was held on August 10th. It was held in Sylvania and was our major fundraising event for the year. The circus held 2 shows and was well attended. \$2151 was raised.

WAPAKONETA Otterbein St. Marys annual Fish Fry and Picnic was on August 18th. Using our 1938 Pierce Arrow Lions trailer, we provided

cotton candy, popcorn, and snow cones to residents and family members during festivities. \$400 was raised. Auglaize County Farm Bureau Family Picnic was on August 18th. Using our iconic 1938 Pierce Arrow Lions trailer, we provide cotton candy, snow cones, and popcorn for the festivities. The event raised \$250.

VAN BUREN The garage sale fundraising event was held on August 24th. Collected items and then sold them to raise money. Money will later be relegated to other charities.

WAUSEON On August 7th, Our club held its annual club picnic/business meeting to plan out our club's fall business. We enjoyed a potluck meal, had several guests in attendance to share Lions with. We enjoyed fellowship with one another in a relaxed atmosphere at Harrison Lake, with the weather cooperating, no rain.
