

New Main Street Building To House Gallaher Super-Store

Modern Brick Structure to be Erected on Site of Business Block Fire; Excavation to Start Monday; Long-Term Lease Signed

A modern fireproof building will be erected at 322-324 South Main street on the site of a business block fire last March, it was announced yesterday by Herbert Kessel, owner of the site.

The Gallaher Drug company of Dayton has entered into a long-term lease with Mr. Kessel for the new building which will house a Gallaher super-drug store.

The store will contain all of the latest facilities for conducting the drug business today, according to M. K. Wood, president and general manager of the Gallaher company.

Excavation of the two lots will start Monday, it was announced. The building of brick and steel construction, completely fireproof, will be 44 feet by 190 feet.

The front section of the building, it was said, will be of two-story height in keeping with the fronts of the adjoining Main street structures. The rear of the building will be one-story.

The long-term lease of the property was announced by R. E. Fahrendorf of the Arthur Beerman Realty company, Dayton. Attorneys participating in the transaction were Leo Wineberger of Wineberger and Grad, Cincinnati, and Aaron Blackford of Findlay.

The Henry Stock company of Dayton will be the contractor for the new building, which was designed by Geyer and Neuffer, Dayton architects. Robert Alge of Findlay is the consulting architect.

Until completion of the building, the Gallaher store will continue in business in its present location, 320 South Main street.

BRIDGE ABUTMENT MASHED BY TRUCK

Shelby Driver Uninjured in Mishap on U.S. 30-N West of Williamstown

Paul S. Young, 26-year-old Shelby truck driver, escaped injury when his truck struck a bridge over Eagle creek, two miles west of Williamstown on U. S. 30-N, shearing off the north side of the concrete structure.

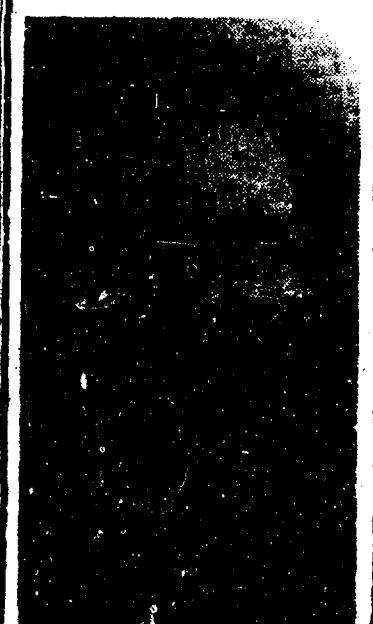
