

CLUB MEMBERS COMPLIMENTED ON THEIR WORK

B. P. Sandles Speaks Before 4-H Group At Achievement Program

(Lima News Bureau) OTTAWA, Oct. 28 — Complimenting Putnam-co youths for their showing in recent years at the annual Ohio State fair, B. P. Sandles, manager of the state junior fair at Columbus, was the principal speaker during the annual 4-H club achievement program in the auditorium-gymnasium here Monday night.

During the program, certificates and pins were awarded to 413 boys and girls as well as to one adult leader in recognition of their 4-H club work. Mrs. D. C. Eaton of Leipsic, chairman of the county 4-H council and leader of a Leipsic girls' club, received a bronze pin for more than five years of service.

DIRECTORS OF NEW BUILDING, LOAN SELECTED

Officers For Wapakoneta Institution Soon Will Be Named

(Lima News Bureau) WAPAKONETA, Oct. 28 — Newly elected directors of the Home Savings and Loan-association being organized here, were announced today by Roy E. Layton, attorney. The new institution was incorporated last week in Columbus with a capital stock of \$1,000,000.

The officers named are F. M. Swonguer, local merchant; J. J. Moeller, local industrialist; A. L. McMurray, local bank official; Carl W. Painter, secretary of the defunct Wapakoneta Building and Savings-association; Rue P. Melehing, editor of the Wapakoneta Daily News, and Layton. They will meet in the near future to elect officers.

Proceedings taken to date for organization of the new loan institution have been submitted to the state building and loan department and to Federal Insurance and Savings Corp. and to the Federal Home Loan bank of Cincinnati for approval.

Following complete organization, the new company plans to take over approved assets of the defunct Wapakoneta Building and Savings-association, which recently was forced into liquidation following the discovery of a \$97,000 shortage, and the Citizens Building and Loan Co.

Asa A. Crawford, 52, former secretary of the defunct loan company, was indicted for embezzling \$17,500 of the company's funds by the last session of grand jury. He is in the county jail in default of \$20,000 bond, awaiting trial, which has been assigned for Monday.

STATE WONDERS ABOUT MAKING OF AUTO TAGS

COLUMBUS, O., Oct. 28 (AP) — Steel priorities can have little effect on Ohio's 1942 automobile license plates but may influence the production of 1943 tags, Cylon W. Wallace, state registrar of motor vehicles, asserted today.

Licenses for 1942 are about 80 per cent finished in the Ohio penitentiary shop, Wallace said, but 1,200 tons of steel will be needed by Feb. 1 to start work on 2,300,000 pairs of 1943 plates.

The Office of Production Management is considering the matter of steel priorities for plates and a spokesman said it hoped to have the 30,000 tons annually going into the tags through the nation.

Suggestions for saving steel included using only one tag on each vehicle and inserting a small metal strip in old tags to denote the current year.
