Hello my fellow Lions of OH1,

I spent part of Friday night and much of Saturday this past weekend doing yard work. I had actually circled the weekend on my calendar nearly three years ago. No, I didn't circle it on my calendar with the plans of doing yard work rather it was the weekend that I had scheduled on our calendars to hold our district convention. Well, unfortunately, due to the severity of the corona virus we had to take the prudent



action of postponing our district convention. All the districts in our state also had to postpone or cancel their convention with the exception of OH7 which had theirs early in March before the severity of this virus hit our country.

Besides our district convention many of you may be wondering about our state convention. I can tell you that it is still, tentatively, scheduled for the weekend of May 15-17 and we should be able to tell you definitively by May1st or a day or two later after the governor of the state, Mike DeWine, decide whether the travel ban can be lifted or must stay in place. Also, the International convention in Singapore has been cancelled and won't be rescheduled. Our current International Officers will serve one more year.

Second, your club must also hold your club elections and report your results to LCI and please also report to PDG Nick Schmunk and Lion Ashley for they are doing our district directory this upcoming year and the goal is to have them completed by July 1, 2020 the start of the new Lion year.

Now there are two other events still up in the air. One is our final cabinet meeting. If you have a report that was due for our cabinet meeting please send that to CS/PDG Sheryl by April 25, 2020 Sheryl will compile them and send out to everyone. After May 1 we will see if we can have a cabinet meeting in person or we may just have it virtual since it may just be a pro forma meeting. The other event, notice, I said the convention was postponed. I am still hoping to hold a one day convention/district celebration. Note, two of the events we would have had at our convention we will have already completed, the election and cabinet meeting so any convention/celebration we are able to hold we should be able to complete in a morning, afternoon or evening whenever or wherever we are able to hold it.

Finally but most importantly we are Lions and we still need to live our motto and serve the best we can. We had our virtual meeting this past Saturday and I plan on holding a virtual meeting every Saturday night at 7Ppm Where we can simply discuss what our clubs can and are doing to best serve our communities in this trying time. LCIF NEWS

To keep everyone up to date and informed regarding LCIF's response to the COVID-19 pandemic, LCIF has awarded a total of US\$925,000 for 14 Emergency grants to Districts and Multiple Districts across the globe. As of March 30, 2020, CAIV has received US\$400,000, CAV has received US\$295,000 and most recently CAI has received US\$200,000 for MD20 (New York). In New York, Lions plan to aid food banks, pantries, and movement of purchased medications by providing labor to gather from sources, load/unload, sort and stage for delivery of all contributed food and medication. The number of requests being received has significantly increased since last week. We expect this to be the trend moving forward. PDG Barbara
