STATEMENTS FROM IVDG DAVE STOCKUM

The snow has fallen, the temperature has dropped significantly, and while it is a winter wonderland outside, we are left wondering when the thermometer will work its way back up to seasonal levels. Be careful shoveling snow and look out for ice in the coming days. Let's hope Buckeye Chuck sees enough shadow to put Spring around the corner. Spring means we will be gathering in Findlay for our annual District Convention on Saturday, April 9. If you would

like to meet our Convention Guests, ID Dianne Pitts and her husband PCC Joe, in a less formal setting, you are invited to join us Friday evening, April 8, for dinner and hospitality provided by the Kalida Lions and our District Convention Committee. Convention materials are posted later in this newsletter and on the Website. Look at the Website as you are able; Lion Rick Carder has been a busy Lion with all the updates we have been asking him to do lately. The web address is: ohiolionsoh1.org. Better weather also means we will be able to get out in our communities more often to serve families and individuals who need our support. For our farmers, getting the machinery ready for planting will be another priority. Let's get active, but let's do it safely.

Speaking of our Convention, I have two areas of which I would like to remind Lions in OH1. First of all, one of the major roles of a Lions Convention is to undertake the election of District Officers and certain State committee positions. This year, we are electing a Second Vice District Governor, a First Vice District Governor, and a District Governor. If you wish to run for one of the

Vice District Governor offices, you must submit a Letter of Intent to our Cabinet Secretary, PDG Sheryl Burnette. Your club must also submit a letter to PDG Sheryl stating that the club approves of your candidacy and that you are a Lion in good standing. The current First Vice District Governor (me!) runs unopposed for District Governor unless there is a vote of no confidence or the 1VDG is no longer a Lion in good standing. These conditions are also certified by a letter from the 1VDG's club. We have a State Committee position on the Finance and Long Range Planning Committee open this year as well. All that is required is a Letter of Intent, again sent to CS Sheryl. All of the above communications with CS Sheryl must be in her hands by April 1 so she can print the ballots for the Convention Election Session.

The second aspect of Convention to which we must attend as soon as possible is preparing for our Necrology Service. If a Lion in your club has passed since last March, please send a picture and brief bio of his/her Lions activities to 1VDG Dave Stockum. To date, that number is approaching 20 members. If you believe that a Lion was left out at last year's Convention, send a picture and bio likewise. This service is a way we can both remember and honor those who have served faithfully as a Lion and who have been dear friends. Our Code of Ethics says this about Friendship: To Hold friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one to another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given. I have admired this idea since I first encountered it as a Lion – Friends in Service!

Women Lions, look for information on how to participate in the May 14th New Voices Workshop which will be held at the Hilton Garden Inn in Findlay. Only the first 100 registrants will be accepted. PID Jennifer Ware from the Upper Peninsula of that state up north will be the keynote speaker, and four female past council chairs from MD13 will be guiding sessions aimed at women in leadership and recruiting women members for our clubs. You will love the enthusiasm and energy of PID Jennifer. One of the past council chairs is our own Darlene Roll who has played such an important leadership role in OH1 over the years. Current Council Chair Kerry Parker from next door district OH2 is

another. CC Kerry is doing an outstanding job this year and is a dynamic speaker. Registration materials will be available in mid-February. Save that date of May 14!
