This month I am encouraging clubs to familiarize themselves with the Ohio Plan, a MD-13 approach. This plan is listed as one of the links at the Ohio Lions website, ohiolions.org. It is based on looking at your community and listing all potential Lions, contacting them as potential members, and following up on the initial contacts. Many Ohio clubs have used this plan successfully over the years. It can be repeated as many times as the club is willing to undertake it. The plan is simple if someone in your club (presumably the membership chairperson) is willing to study the plan and organize an Ohio Plan team for your club. I'll outline the international plan, NAMI, in next month's newsletter.

Best wishes for a safe and happy 2021. It is my hope that travel will open up this spring, and I will be able to visit all of the clubs in OH1, Region 2, as well as some of the clubs I haven't met in Region 1.


DISTRICT CONVENTION
