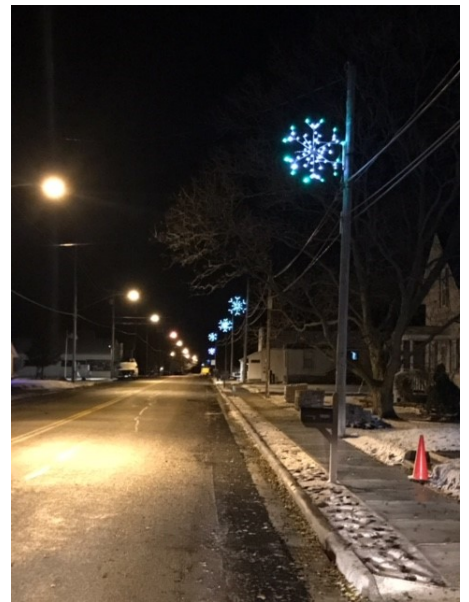

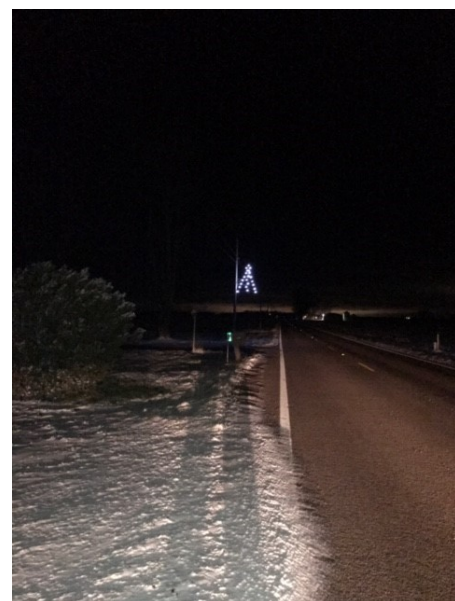
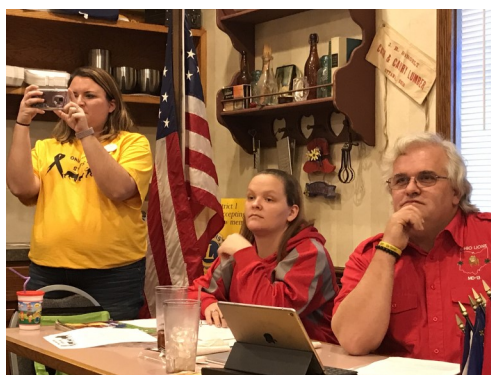

Service, Fundraising, and Social Events

Vision Activities



WAYNESFIELD On November 7th PCC Darlene attended the McCormick Vision Center's Job Fair at Goodwill Lima. Resource materials picked up and information shared.

On November 28th PCC Darlene participated in the Northwest Ohio Lions Eye Care Foundation (NWOLECF) meeting at Henry's in Ottawa. She serves as president (photo left.)

Waynesfield also reported eyeglass collection on November 20th, when PCC Darlene collected more than 50 pairs of eyeglasses at one location, November 22nd when more than 75 pairs of eyeglasses were collected from one location in Coldwater and on November 25th when 15 pairs of eyeglasses were collected from Stony Creek Church.

PIONEER On November 28th 2 Pioneer Area Lions attended the NW Ohio Eyecare meeting in Ottawa.

MC COMB On November 28th Attended the North West Ohio Lions Eye Care Foundation Meeting (NWOLECF) Meeting at Henry's in Ottawa.

WAUSEON On November 7th our club conducted a Preschool Vision Screening at 2 of our community's Preschools. We screened 34 children between the ages of 2 and 4. We had no referrals, though we had one child that didn't pass the color blind test and we passed that information on to the parents so that the child could be tested further from an optometrist.

Wauseon also reported that on November 15th, the club helped an individual get an eye exam and a pair of glasses that was in need in our community at the cost of \$149.00. On November 20th 145 used eyeglasses collected from the community. We have several donation boxes located within our community. We then donate the eyeglasses that we collect to VOSH to be used on mission trips to third world countries.

SYLVANIA SUNRISE On November 7th, 4 Sylvania Sunrise Lions members attended a Bedford Lions club meeting to ask for funds for the Visually Impaired Christmas dinner to be held in December, 2018. They were very generous with a donation of \$500 for this event. Sylvania held a raffle at Charter Night on November 14th and Lions brought in prizes to be raffled off. Much fun was had by our Lions and guests at this event. Monies raised will help with the Visually Impaired Christmas party.

PERRYSBURG SUNRISE On November 28th at the North West Ohio Lions Eye Care Foundation meeting, the group discussed 12 cases either for surgery, bioptic lenses, or CCTV usage. Most cases were approved. One of our members is the Treasurer of the foundation.

Perrysburg also reported that on November 23rd one Lion assisted two adults in getting an eye exam and ordering glasses. He drove them to/from the Doctor's offices for the exam and a week later to pick up the glasses. We were assisted by Prevent Blindness, Inc. On November 19th and again on November 5th, two members drove a blind member and her Pilot Dog to/from the club meeting. On November 8th eyeglasses were picked up at 5 locations. Damaged glasses will be donated to VOSH Ohio to be sold for the value of their parts. Funds raised will be used to fund vision mission trips. Usable glasses will be used on our annual vision mission to Mexico.

Perrysburg held a Blind Ministries Outreach Meeting on November 3rd. Our club hosted and served a Turkey Dinner for them. We ordered the food through Bob Evans Restaurant, and drove several of the participants to/from the event.

PORTAGE On November 1st screened 17 preschoolers at Montessori School in Bowling Green. There was one referral. On November 28th Collected and donated 1256 eyeglasses and over 200 sunglasses to VOSH.

OTTAWA On November 14th. The Ottawa Lions cleaned and sorted eyeglasses for the VOSH group in Pandora.

NORTH BALTIMORE Reported on November 20th that 11 North Baltimore Lions Club members delivered 510 pair of glasses to VOSH in Pandora and volunteered for 2 1/2 hours working in the center.

NAPOLEON reported on November 1st that 429 eyeglasses donated to VOSH and on November 7th collected 3 pair.

LIMA HOST held a Vision screening on November 13th at area preschool

KENTON On November 10th that 30 eyeglasses collected from Dr. Warner's office by PDG Bill Keller and on November 21st Lion Secretary Alger Gibson donated 11 pairs of eyeglasses during our Kenton Lions Club meeting.

FINDLAY On November 26th, one Eye Case was reviewed and possibly approved pending results of her operation. 30 pairs of reading glasses were dispensed during the month of November. The count on the Used Glasses that were picked up and delivered to VOSH was 940. A near record.

DESHLER On November 12th purchased a pair of glasses for a deserving individual 306.60.

Hunger Relief

PERRYSBURG SUNRISE Donates food to Maumee United Methodist Church food pantry. 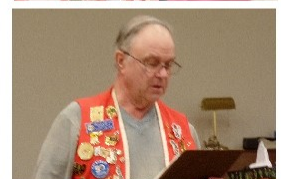
